Recently, I voted *against* a plan by Mayor Miller to introduce new taxes (i.e., a land transfer tax, a vehicle licensing tax, etc) as a means of resolving the City's budget problems. I believe the City must do more to reduce costs and find efficiencies before considering any tax increase.

Report from Bas Balkissoon, M.P.P.



In the past, too many of our young people were not getting the help and assistance they needed to move on to postsecondary education. They left high school with little opportunity, less hope, and even fewer options.

That is why I am pleased to share an update of our government's commitment to assist youths in achieving their potential and reaching their goals.

Today we have 86,000 more students in postsecondary institutions than in 2004 because we have invested in more opportunities and more assistance. One in four students receive a grant from the province. We have also increased the maximum available OSAP aid by \$2,550 for single students to a total of \$11,900. These are the types of changes that are giving students better access to a greater quality of learning.

Our young people work hard to get to university and postsecondary facilities. This is why I feel it is important to help them stay there. Through these provincial grants and a strengthened student-aid system, we are working with your child's best interests in mind so that everyone can benefit from improved postsecondary education in Ontario.
