Message from Councillor Chin Lee

Dear Rosewood Neighbour,

At the time of writing this report, we are still coping with a lot of snow. Eventually this snow will melt and could cause flooding of roads and basements. Although crews are clearing snow from the 150,000 catch basins across the city, we are asking residents, where possible, to help by exposing the drains in front of their home. If you do experience flooding due to a blocked catch basin, please call me as soon as possible so that I can take action.

Another consequence of this year's heavy snow and ice is potholes. Since January the City has filled over 40,000 potholes (at an average cost of \$25 to \$35 per hole). The key to keeping repairs costs down is to fix potholes early while they're still small. You can help by calling the pothole hotline at 416-599-9090, press the pound key (#), then 164, to leave a message about the location of a pothole.

Report from Bas Balkissoon, M.P.P.

Dear Constituents,



It is my pleasure communicating with you. I have been appointed to the Cabinet Committee on Poverty by the Premier. Members of this committee, chaired by Hon. Deb Matthews,

Minister of Children and Youth Services, will work to develop poverty indicators and targets, and a focused strategy for reducing child poverty and lifting more families out of poverty. The goal of this committee is to make progress in the fight against poverty over the course of the government's four-year mandate. The committee will come up with some short term and some long term goals.

The McGuinty government is proposing changes to the Building Code which would require the mandatory sprinklering of new multiple-unit residential buildings greater than three storeys in height. Public safety is a priority for the provincial government. Residents who are concerned are encouraged to attend information sessions in late March and early April. The date, time, and location of these sessions will be posted on the Building Code website www.ontario.ca/buildingcode.
